

**Esther "Pop" Quiz #0044:
"Sitting 4th on a Trick that Opponents Will Win,
Should You Play 'High' or 'Low'?"**

Bidding

<i>WEST</i>	<i>NORTH</i>	<i>EAST</i>	<i>SOUTH</i>

EAST is sitting "on lead". EAST's Partner has bid Clubs twice, so WEST's first Club bid was not a "short Club". Therefore, on Trick #1 EAST leads the highest card he holds in Partner WEST's bid Suit, Clubs, leading his Club Ten. You are sitting NORTH. Here are the Club holdings in the 4 Hands:

<i>NORTH</i>	
C: Q 9	
<i>WEST</i>	<i>EAST</i>
C: A K 8 4 2	C: T 5 3
<i>SOUTH</i>	
C: J 7 6	

- 1. SOUTH plays "second Hand low" by playing his Club 6. WEST plays his Club King. What Club should **you** sitting NORTH play on Trick #1?*
