The "**BBO Bridge Master**" website allows you to declare your skill level, then shows a series of Hands and announces the final contract, each of which you then play as Declarer. At the end of play you can then request a solution in which the optimal "Line of Play" is discussed step by step. The present "Esther Bridge 'Pop' Quiz" question is drawn from "**BBO Bridge Master**" Level-3 **Lesson D-16**. Note that across repeated play "**BBO Bridge Master**" may change some Hands in given lessons. Esther may have altered some cards in some Hands.

BBO Bridge Master Level 3 Lesson D-16

Dealer: **SOUTH**

NORTH (11)

S: 4 2

H: A K Q

D: Q T 9 8 7 6 5

C: 2

WEST (14)

S: J T 9 7

H: 7 5

D: A K 4

C: K Q J 3

EAST (2)

S: 8 6 5 3

H: J T 9 8 6

D: J 3

C: 6 4

SOUTH (13)

S: A K Q

H: 4 3 2

D: 2

C: A T 9 8 7 5

Bidding

SOUTH	WEST	NORTH	EAST
1 C	PASS	1 D	PASS
2 C	PASS	2 H	PASS
2 NT	PASS	PASS	PASS

On Trick #1 WEST leads the Spade Jack, the "top" of a sequence of "touching" Honors in 1 of his 2 "longest and strongest" Suits. SOUTH did not lead Clubs because SOUTH bid Clubs twice during the auction.

1. Once the NORTH Dummy is exposed what "winning" Tricks can Declarer SOUTH see?
2. What dangers should Declarer SOUTH see?
3. After Declarer SOUTH "wins" Trick #1 in his "closed" (hidden) Hand, what card should SOUTH lead on Trick #2?
