The "**BBO Bridge Master**" website allows you to declare your skill level, then shows a series of Hands and announces the final contract, each of which you then play as Declarer. At the end of play you can then request a solution in which the optimal "Line of Play" is discussed step by step. Here we use the *free* "**BBO Bridge Master**" Level-3 **Lesson B-25** which gives you the opportunity to see and *repeatedly practice* playing a given bridge Board. Esther may have altered some of the cards in the Hands.

BBO Bridge Master Level 3 Lesson B-25

Dealer: **SOUTH**

NORTH (19)

S: A K Q 5
H: 5 3 2
D: J T 9
C: A K Q

WEST (2)

S: J T 8
H: J T 9
D: 6 4 3 2
C: 5 3 2

EAST (0)

S: 9 7 6
H: 8 7 6
D: 8 7 5
C: 8 7 6 4

SOUTH (19)

S: 4 3 2
H: A K Q 4
D: A K Q
C: J T 9

Bidding

SOUTH	WEST	NORTH	EAST
1 C	PASS	1 S	PASS
2 NT	PASS	7 NT	PASS
PASS	PASS		

On Trick #1 WEST leads his Heart Jack, EAST "follows", and SOUTH plays his own Heart Queen.

1. Once the NORTH Dummy is exposed what "winners" can Declarer SOUTH see?
2. What "Line of Play" seems most promising for Declarer SOUTH to follow?
3. Which of the 2 possible "Lines of Play" is more likely to be needed?
